"Millions in stadium contracts on the way" Nassau Guardian, Page A5, Saturday, 2nd October 2010

Today's (2nd October 2010) issue of the Nassau Guardian carried a story on page A5 outlining the need for the government to borrow fifty million dollars to finish the Oakes Field stadium and build the necessary supporting infrastructure.

So, the \$30million dollar 'gift of a stadium' to be built primarily with foreign labour sending their labour income out of the country and paying for most of the material to foreign providers, finally comes clear to one and all. Taxpayers are going to pay for the borrowing of another \$50million dollars in order to complete the building and the infrastructure. So, the \$30million stadium is actually going to cost \$80million. What is the \$50million to be spent on? Maybe, someone will outline the stadium related items?
